**April devotions** are addressed to the Eucharist, to the Holy Spirit and to Divine Mercy. The Eucharist symbolizes the sacrifice of Jesus, which is renewed at every Mass, and His being descending on those He loved to protect them and guide them after His death. The Eucharist contains in itself all the love of Jesus, in all its forms: crucified, adoring, contemplative, praying, intoxicating. To reserve time and attention to this devotion leads to the attainment of many graces and a sense of closeness to the priceless love of God. Jesus dictated the Chaplet of Divine Mercy to Saint Faustina Kowalska in 1935, promising that whoever recites this prayer would have the certainty of dying in peace and grace, and of letting those who have listened to them die peacefully. This devotion guarantees forgiveness even to the most hardened and recidivist sinners, showing the immensity of Jesus' mercy.

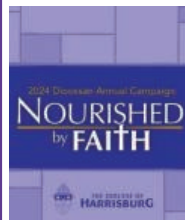

Sunday, April 7, 2024  
The Second Sunday of Easter  
Acts 4:32-35; 1 Jn 5:1-6; Jn 20:19-31



At a gathering, there's always someone who's willing to speak up when everybody else may be wondering the same thing but is afraid to ask. In today's gospel, it's Thomas who voices the doubts and fears with which others are also struggling. The Fourth Evangelist frequently uses one character as a representative figure. In today's gospel, Thomas stands for everyone who is a follower of Jesus yet harbors doubts.

In the first scene, the disciples are together, locked in their fear, when Jesus stands in their midst. His double declaration, "Peace be with you," recalls his promise of peace that casts our fear (14:27). Jesus then shows the disciples his hands and side, the unerasable evidence of the brutality inflicted on him. Oddly enough, instead of increasing their terror, this gesture causes them to rejoice. The explanation is found in the Last Supper scene, where Jesus spoke to his disciples about his impending death, likening his pain and theirs to the labor pangs of a woman giving birth, whose agony turns to joy after the new life is brought forth. Jesus had assured them that when they would see him again, their hearts would rejoice with a joy no one could take from them (16:20-22).

Jesus then sends the disciples to continue the mission for which the Father sent him. In John's Gospel, there is no calling or sending of the Twelve; the mission is entrusted to all disciples here, as they are empowered with the Spirit. As Jesus breathes on them, the new life brought forth through his death and resurrection vivifies them. The image is reminiscent of the creation of the first human being, into whose nostrils the Creator breathes the breath of life (Gen 2:7). It also calls to mind Ezekiel's vision of the valley of dry bones, over which he prophesies, "I will make breath enter you so you many come to life" (Ezek 37:5). Just as God restored hope to the disheartened Babylonian exiles, so the risen Christ breathes peace and joy into the fearful disciples.

The power that the disciples receive with this infusion of the Spirit is the ability to heal and forgive. When Jesus shows his wounds, we see that forgiveness does not erase them, nor does it dismiss them as unimportant. Telling the truth about them is essential for forgiveness and healing.

In the second scene, Thomas stands for all who were not present in the initial experience with the resurrected Christ. Just as Mary Magdalene did, so the disciples declare, "We have seen the Lord" (20:17, 25). But belief on the basis of another's word is not sufficient (see 4:42); one must have firsthand experience of Christ in order to participate in the mission. Jesus once again stands in their midst, bringing peace. He directs Thomas to probe the meaning of his wounds so that he too can become an agent of forgiveness and healing. When Thomas makes his acclamation of faith, Jesus affirms that there are two ways of blessedness: believing by having seen, and believing without having seen. The crucial thing is to believe, so as to have life.

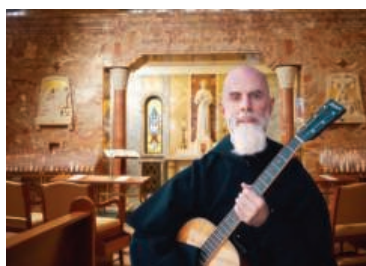

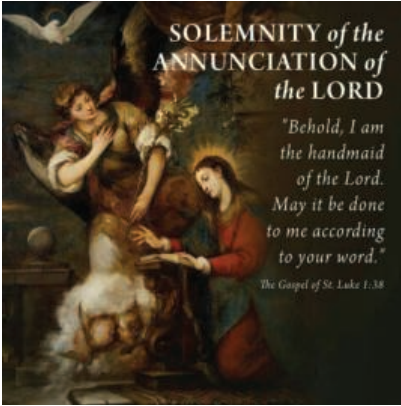

## Daily Readings & Reflections



### Monday, April 8, 2024 The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord

Is 7:10-14; 8:10; Heb 10:4-10, Lk 1:26-38

The Annunciation is a beautiful feast that celebrates Mary's "yes" to God during her encounter with the angel Gabriel. Mary doesn't rattle off a quick response but rather pauses and ponders, wondering what this might mean.

Her response is a choice not simply to give birth to a child, but to fully embrace her identity and her calling as an intimate companion with God. "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord." It is as if Mary is saying, "Look! My life is fully in God! Everything about who I am is for and with God!" During this day of Annunciation, reflect on your daily "yesses." How do these reflect your own identity and life in God?

### Tuesday, April 9, 2024 Easter Weekday

Acts 4:32-37; John 3:7b-15

In 1098, Saint Anselm wrote the treatise "Why the God-Man?" to champion a core Christian tenet: the Incarnation—the belief that Jesus was both fully human and fully divine. Incarnation is a big deal. Nearly every heresy tackled by the Early Church concerned errant beliefs about Jesus' true nature. No, we don't believe that Jesus was merely human (Arianism) or that he was all divine, only pretending to be human (Docetism). We believe that the second person of the Trinity took on human flesh to save us. Now more than ever, what good news that is!

### Wednesday, April 10, 2024 Easter Weekday

Acts 5:17-26; John 3:16-21

"Saint Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life. . . . This sister now cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed her." Thus opens *Laudato Si'*, Pope Francis' encyclical "On Care for Our Common Home." Shine a light on what each of us can do to clean up the planet going forward.

### Thursday, April 11, 2024 Easter Weekday Saint Stanislaus, Bishop & Martyr

Acts 5:27-33; Jn 3:31-36

One of the engaging things about saints like Stanislaus from centuries ago (b. 1030) is the legends that spring up about them—perhaps not true in a literal way but often carrying kernels of wisdom of a deeper order. Bishop Stanislaus is said to have brought a man who had been dead three years back to life in order to foil a land-grabbing plot of a nefarious king. Given three days to produce a witness to the church's claim on the land, he prayed ceaselessly before calling the seller of the land from the grave to testify on his behalf. The take-away? God hears and responds to your fervent prayers.



### Friday, April 12, 2024 Easter Weekday

Acts 5:34-42; Jn 6:1-15

If you grew up in a household marked by scarcity, the "theology of abundance" might be hard to embrace. This concept, popularized by Lutheran theologian Walter Brueggemann, is that God's generosity and abundance are overflowing, and that discipleship means sharing freely of both material and spiritual riches to rid the world of poverty in all its forms. How do you experience God's overflowing generosity? And how are you paying it forward?



### Saturday, April 13, 2024 Easter Weekday

St. Martin I, Pope & Martyr  
Acts 6:1-7; Jn 6:16-21

The Sea of Galilee is said to be prone to sudden, violent storms, with temperature swings and gusty winds provoked by the high mountains that surround it. Whether we understand Jesus walking on the choppy waters literally or figuratively, the message is clear: Jesus is our bridge over troubled waters. Whatever turbulence you might be experiencing, reach out a hand to the many incarnations of Christ in your life—those who will stand by you and stand with you, those who are ready to reach out a steadying hand as you face the storms of life.
